Public Input:

Members of the Hyde County Childcare Development Organization asked if the school could send out a survey to the parents of children who go to Highmore-Harrold, asking if there was interest in an after-school program for grades Kindergarten through Sixth Grade. The Childcare Board would come up with the questions and would be working with members of FCCLA to create the survey. They also requested if a survey to students could also go out in helping run the program with the option to do it as volunteer work. The school would be happy to send out the survey to both parent emails and via text.

Superintendent's Report

- American Education Week runs from November $13^{th} 17^{th}$. The School Board will be sponsoring meat and cheese trays in the teacher's lounges to show their appreciation.
- At the end of each quarter, a staff survey goes out to nominate who will be that quarter's Staff Spotlight. Surveys are broken down between two groups, one for the elementary and one for the high school. This quarter's Staff Spotlight winners are Brian Marso and Alana Kroeplin. Willow Creek Steakhouse has graciously offered to sponsor the program by giving each winner a \$20 gift certificate. We thank our staff for their continuous work in teaching our future leaders.
- Final Average Daily Membership is 232.5 students.
- The Farm and Home Show has been moved to January 20th, which is when the Cracker Barrel will be held at 9:20 a.m. in the auditorium. Districts 23 and 24 will be in attendance.
- The Governor's Budget Address will be held on December 5th.

PreK-12 Principal's Report

- The Midterm for the 2nd quarter will be November 17, 2023.
- Fall sports is wrapping for the state and winter sport practices will officially start November 13, for wrestling, November 20 for GBB, and November 27 for BB.
- There was a nice turnout for the Veteran's Day Program.

- FCCLA will have family week November 20 November 22, 2023.
- November 22 we will have an early dismissal for Thanksgiving and no school on November 23 or 24, 2023.
- December 5, 2023 at 7pm will be the k-12 music Christmas concert in the auditorium.

Business Manager's Report

- Preliminary Valuations for Taxes Payable 2024 are up from last year by \$23,144,709. With
 the drop in tax levies, this has decreased the maximum tax request for the General Fund
 by \$4,526. This is due to an increase in valuation and a decrease in levies set by the
 legislature for Taxes Payable 2024. Since the school is on State Aid, the state will kick in
 the difference to make us in congruent with the funding the school is expected to get.
- A donation letter was given to the Todd Cowan Family to the amount of \$3,161.60 for their 1,040 lb. hanging weight, at the price of \$3.04/lb.
- To date, we have the remainder of \$48,546.00 left to spend of ESSER III funding. We have an additional \$15,121 to drawdown yet that consists of this year's laptops, workbooks, and computer software. This puts us with \$33,425 left to spend by September 2024.

Old Business:

New Business:

Motion by Haiwick and seconded by Semmler to amend custodian and food service substitute pay to equal certified staff substitute rates; approve contract Jessica Sheffield, Volunteer Girl's Basketball Coach; approve contract Kristina Schafer, Volunteer Wrestling Coach; approve contract Joe Schafer, Volunteer Wrestling Coach; approve contract Amy Robb, Junior High Boy's Basketball Coach, \$2,221. The motion passed.

Motion by Haiwick and seconded by McCloud to approve Morris Inc. bid for 6-lane track project as designed by Civil Designs, Inc., \$707,006.50. The motion passed.

Motion by Mitchell and seconded by Haiwick to approve Co-op Wrestling and Football agreements with Miller School District with the amendment of adding one JH/JV football game if facilities dictate. The motion passed.

First Reading of Policy AA, Policy ABA, Policy ABAA were held. Policy ABAA-R, ABAA-CP, and AC will be discussed at December's board meeting.

The Board set their next regular meeting for December 11, 2023 at 7:00 p.m.

Motion by Semmler and seconded by Haiwick to enter Executive Session at 8:10 p.m. for Personnel SDCL 1-25-1(1).
